Comments from Questionnaires

- "Village needs a casual meeting place."
- "Other villages have full recycling facilities why don't we?"
- "Encouraging families and young children here, and to stay here, should influence all decisions concerning the village."
- "Use of a house as a holiday cottage should be subject to planning permission as a change of use."
- "...it is vital that everything is done to protect the environment, and the physical safety of villagers, especially in narrow lanes used by large lorries."
- "...Village Hall doesn't seem to be used as much as in previous years."
- "...don't let the questionnaire/appraisal become a vehicle for demands for increasing suburbanisation."
- "The major danger (on the roads) is access to the A12."
- "A recycling bank should be sensitively sited/screened so that it is not an eyesore."
- "Wenhaston would benefit from outdoor courts and a basketball court."

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Introduction

The Village Appraisal Questionnaire was a survey of local opinion that covered a wide range of topics. The results have been collated on a database which will provide valuable information for years to come.

The information collected has been summarised, as clearly as possible, in this report. Too many statistics and too much detail would make it difficult and tedious to read and some important issues may become obscured by a mass of detail. This report, therefore, aims to highlight those topics on which the village has responded most strongly.

When looking at the figures and percentages, please bear in mind that many of the questions allowed more than one response so do not expect either percentages or numbers of people to add up to 100% or total number of respondents.

The reader may look for a list of immediate action points but they will find none. We believe that villagers should have the chance to think about the views expressed and debate them. This summary of results provides a first opportunity to agree together on any further action.

Was there enough interest?

In Wenhaston with Mells there are 421 properties. The delivery/collection team delivered 368 questionnaires of which 298 were returned, an 80% return. This is an unusually high level of response and represents a clear and honest picture of the view of the village community.

Since the delivery team was extremely persistent the fact that it was impossible to deliver to around 50 houses suggests that approx. 12% of properties are holiday/second homes.

Some interesting facts emerge from the preliminary details of age and length of domicile:

Over half the adult population (53%) is in the 25-59 year age group.

However, 30% are aged 65 years or over.

Only a very few people have lived in Wenhaston all their lives (1.2%). Nearly 60% have lived in the village for less than 15 years. However, nearly 40% of those moving into the village are from less than 30 miles away and can reasonably be described as local.

In response to the question which asked why they came to live in Wenhaston, 50% of respondents said "love of village or country life".

Young Persons' Questionnaire

As with the Main Questionnaire, there was a high response rate. 53 young people, with an average age of 12.3 years, provided returns. We calculate this is a 75%-80% response rate.

As expected, most of them attended either Bungay High or Halesworth Middle Schools. The vast majority travelled there by bus (75%), ninety-four per cent say they intend to continue their education when they reach 16 years, either in the sixth form or at College.

Over three-quarters of them say that their friends live outside the village and that meeting them represents real difficulties. Over 80% say there is no Public Transport at the right time or it's just too far. There is heavy dependence on parents and friends for lifts. Less than 20% cycle to travel out of the village. It may be of interest that over half say they would use an improved bus service.

So far as leisure is concerned, about two thirds of the respondents take part in after-school activities. Popular activities are Music/Choir, followed by Drama. Favourite sports are football, followed by swimming. When asked to name and rank their three favourite sports, tennis came top, followed by football, then basketball, then swimming. Clearly there is a considerable support for the provision of tennis court(s) in Wenhaston.

For example, when asked what is needed on the Playing Field, nearly 70% of all youth said tennis courts. There was also a strong demand for basketball and netball posts, and a 5-a-side pitch. Seventeen per cent would like a skating area. Nearly half said they would like toilets there.

When asked about the Village Hall, the emphasis on sports continued with nearly 70% asking for it to accommodate more sport. They wanted Disco/Music, Youth Club, Drama and Gymnastics.

The Young People like Wenhaston for its peace and quiet. They like the countryside and the commons, and the friendliness of the villagers. Those that do have friends in the village enjoy having their friends close to hand. They say they dislike having nothing to do, distance from friends and lack of transport. Some find Village Hall rules difficult to cope with. They suggest life could be improved by having more clubs and activities, more shops (!) and a more relaxed approach by the Village Hall.

Main Questionnaire

Transport

Few people (7%) have problems travelling out of the village. This reflects the fact that most people (86%) have daytime access to a vehicle. Their main use is for leisure and shopping, though they are important for getting to work and for business purposes.

Contrary to first impressions over 90% of vehicles are either garaged or parked off road. Nevertheless, half of respondents thought that street parking was a safety risk in Wenhaston.

With regard to Public Transport, the major concerns with the Bus Service appear to be the Timetable (50% of those expressing an opinion rated it poor). Access for those with disabilities was rated poor by 80% of those expressing an opinion. There were clear demands for improvements to routes, timetables (especially connections with train services) and cost. It should be noted that half the respondents never used Public Transport; of those that did, more used train services than the bus.

Use of Voluntary Car Service was very low, though this is not to deny the importance of these services to a small section of the village community.

Most people who expressed an opinion on the matter felt that Wenhaston does not need a Car Park. Most were far more concerned about "danger-spots" on the roads. The major blackspot was seen as the top of Blyford Lane, followed by Star Hill.

There were also worries about the Street/Hall Road, Back Road/Bramfield Road crossroads, and the back road to Mells. The latter was seen as particularly dangerous by some. Furthermore, 240 respondents said they felt in danger from speeding traffic. The worst areas were the Street, top of Blyford Lane (again), Star Hill (again) and – sadly – outside the Primary School.

There was no real consensus on the need for footpaths and streetlights despite the fears raised about safety and traffic. A third of respondents would like to see more street lights, and a third would like more pavements. Nearly a third wanted to see no more of either.

Health

Most people have a doctor in either Halesworth or Southwold, and the majority of people say they rarely or never have difficulty getting to them. However, a

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significant number (18%) do report having problems, either occasionally or often.

The services of a doctor are those most in demand with over half the respondents saying they used a doctor often or occasionally. A smaller number (about 30%) used a hospital often or occasionally. When asked how they rated these services 93% rated the hospital service as good or reasonable. Doctors' services were rated even more highly and District Nurses/Health Visitors even more highly still!

There were misgivings about:

• Ambulance Service - 17% rated it poor

• Chiropody - 14% rated it poor

Physiotherapy - 14% rated it poor

A small number of people used Complementary Medicine (23 people in all). Nearly 80% of these rated it good.

Most people reported no problems in collecting prescriptions, but a small number (18) said they did. They can, of course, be collected from "drop-off" points in the village but one of these has just closed (Post Office). This poses particular problems to those who attend doctors in Southwold.

Housing

When asked about the *number* of houses that had been built in the village in the last ten years, half of those replying said it was "about right". However, a quarter said that too many had been built, and the same number (108 people) thought that the houses built were too big. A substantial number (178) said that the houses were too expensive. (This may be a reflection of the sizes of houses built, the rise in house prices in general, or a combination of the two.) Only a small number (7%) thought that there had been too little new housing.

Replies to the question about housing need indicated there was strong support for houses which would be available to local people (51% of respondents) and for low-cost starter homes (53%). (These answers probably reflect the same view in two different ways.) A quarter of replies indicated a need for more Housing Association properties to rent. A need for sheltered accommodation was raised by 67 people (16%), while 20% of respondents said there was no need for any of these.

Environment

The environment is clearly of importance to the people of Wenhaston. Asked about whether the countryside has changed in recent years 40% said it hadn't, but a sizeable proportion (25%) said it had changed for the worse. A large group just didn't know (perhaps they've not been in the village long enough to judge). A small number felt that it had changed for the better.

There is clearly strong support for the need to protect all of our major landscape features:

Hedges 76% of respondents
Open Spaces 71%
Commons 86%

Replies show that commons, woods, hedges and rivers are particularly valued.

When asked about disturbance and nuisance, low-flying aircraft (63%) ranked about the same as dog-fouling as a source of irritation. (Some people feel extremely strongly about the latter). Traffic noise (perhaps surprisingly) was cited by only 19% of respondents as a nuisance.

It is clear, from the returns, that people value:

•	Rural way of life	77%
•	Open space	74%
•	Tranquillity	68%

A sense of community and local identity is clearly important (40%) whilst a third of respondents value village activities.

It was felt that the local environment could be best protected by:

- Recycling
- More local employment
- Improved public transport

Only a relatively small number of respondents felt that litter was a problem and the indication is that it is at its worst on the commons in Summer. Having said that, it must be noted that 40% rated removing litter as very important or important in keeping the countryside attractive. Other factors rated, in this connection, were:

- Verges kept mown and tidy
- Signposting paths and bridleways
- Maintaining gates, stiles and bridges
- Keeping paths clear on commons
- Preventing vehicle damage to road verges

Also rated as important, though not as important as the above, were:

- Making paths accessible to the disabled
- Letting verges grow for wildlife. (How this is reconciled with neat and tidy verges, we don't know!)

Villagers were definitely against the closing of footpaths. Surprisingly there wasn't strong support for traffic reduction (we're assuming people had road traffic in mind and were simply being realistic).

Most respondents (82% of those that had an opinion) seemed to know where the local paths are, and the majority felt that they were well-maintained and signposted. Interestingly, about 60% thought that Wenhaston should have bridleways.

Everyone, but everyone, thought that Wenhaston should have recycling facilities. (There is a Paper Bank at the Primary School, now joined by a Can Bank.) However, when asked where recycling facilities should be sited, 99% (of 354 respondents) said they should be at the Village Hall.

Education, Training and Employment

Firstly, it should be noted that 99% of villagers who expressed an opinion (431 people) rated the Village Primary School as important or very important to the community.

There was also support for pre-school education and activities. There was strong support for after-school clubs and holiday play schemes. (See Summary of Young Persons' Questionnaire where there is a clear demand for more planned activities for the Young in the village).

So far as Adult Education is concerned there appears to be a strong demand for Computing Classes (136 people expressed an interest), Craftwork (110), and Languages (82). Cookery (58), and Car Maintenance (50) also looked like runners (no pun intended!) The most popular time for classes was:

•	Evening	75% of respondents
•	Afternoon	29%
•	Morning	20%

Clearly, most people (but not all) would prefer classes in the evening.

The figures for employment status are interesting:

- 19% (nearly a fifth) are self-employed
- 32% (nearly a third) are employees
- 34.5% (just over a third) are retired compared to 21% of the population nationally

When asked what sports clubs/activities they would join if there were available, it appears that:

- Keep Fit for All Ages was "Top of the Pops" 41%
- Tennis was popular 28%
- Billiards/Snooker were popular 27%
- As was Aerobics 22%

Of the nature of their employment, 50% of respondents were either in:

Retailing or other service industry, or local government/public sector employment. In contrast, numbers in Agriculture, Engineering plus other manufacturing, in aggregate, added up to 20% of the employed total. Broadly, half the respondents worked within 10 miles of Wenhaston, half more than 10 miles away.

There was a reasonable level of support for small business development (36%), whilst opinion was split fairly evenly on the desirability of small scale industrial workshops, and definite reservations/hostility to any further development of tourism.

Social and Entertainment

Asked about new sports or activities people wanted in Wenhaston, there was definite interest in:

•	Wine Tasting	35% of respondents
•	Computer Club	29%

• Photography 20%

There was rather less demand for:

•	Line Dancing	16%
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• Discos 15%

And a fairly low demand for:

•	Bingo	9%
•	Tea Dances	9%

People said they didn't take part in leisure activities because:

•	they didn't want to	9%
•	they were too busy	40%

Unsuitable hours were cited by some (16%), but organisers can be reasonably confident that villagers know about activities. Only 8% mentioned poor publicity as a reason for not taking part.

It was clearly felt that provision of social facilities for children and young people up to the age of 25 years was poor compared to those provided for people over 60 (38% rated them as good or reasonable). In contrast, the comparable figures for young people aged 17-25 years are 3.5% (good or reasonable) with 34% of respondents rating them as poor.

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Significant, but minority sports were:

- Basketball
- Netball
- Judo
- Volleyball

Our figures don't reveal this but one would expect that interest in particular sports would vary considerably across the age spectrum. For example, when asked why they did not participate in any sport, 21% said they were in the wrong age group. Nearly two-thirds (65%) said they simply weren't interested. Finally, 65% (195 people) of those that expressed an opinion on local sports facilities for the disabled thought they were good or reasonable.

Quite predictably, the Village Hall was seen primarily as a venue for social/leisure activities (65% of respondents). This, in itself, is a broad category. In more specific terms people thought that the Village Hall should be used for:

- Drama
- Family Parties
- Club Meetings
- Quiz Nights
- Ceilidhs/Discos

When asked whether the Village Hall met their needs, roughly two-thirds of respondents said it did; one third said it didn't. (Whether the response to this question is age-related we don't know, but we suspect that it is). Of those asked why the Hall didn't meet their needs, roughly a third said rules and regulations put them off. A small number of people (18) thought the Hall wasn't used enough.

A smaller number still (12 people) thought it was expensive. An even smaller number (8) felt it was for minority use only (which is difficult to square with the two-thirds of respondents, 204 people, who said it met their needs). A handful of people gave their opinion that it was the best Village Hall in the area.

Again, predictably, if the Village Hall wasn't used for functions the Church Room or private homes were the most-used alternatives. Other popular alternatives were Holton or Bramfield Village Halls.

Retail Services and Other Facilities

The Postal Service, in general, was rated as good or reasonable by a majority of users. There were, however, some reservations about the size of the post box (i.e. its ability to take large envelopes); nearly 20% of respondents rated it poor in this respect.

Our recently-closed Post Office (see comments later in the Epilogue) appears to have been well-used, though clearly not enough to prevent its closure. For example, nearly all the respondents used its postal services, with nearly a third (116 people) saying they drew their pension/allowances from there. Forty per cent paid regular bills via the Post Office and the same number used it as a source of information. Other services, including Giro Bank, were used by 40% of respondents.

When asked what retail services the Village needs 140 out of 165 replies said a well-stocked Village Shop (this is a whopping 85% of replies). This certainly shows demand but we doubt whether even 140 regular customers could keep a commercial retail shop in business over the long term.

In answer to why they shopped out of the Village, people replied, logically, that what they wanted wasn't available in the Village (though this isn't true of DIY goods, paint etc., which are).

Religion

About 40% of respondents said they were active members of one or other of the Churches. By far the biggest group within those were members of the Church of England (70%). This proportion of the population who are active churchgoers appears very high compared with that in the Country as a whole but perhaps it is characteristic of country areas with a high percentage of older people. We should add that the majority of Wenhaston churchgoers attend worship in the Village. Most people felt that local religious groups contribute to Community life.

When asked what activities they engaged on Sundays, 20% said they went to a place of worship. This conflicts with the figure of 40% active church members but it is from a larger number of respondents. Gardening (60%) is an extremely popular activity as are family outings of one sort or another. Thirty eight per cent attend social events in and around the Village whilst sport is important for nearly a quarter. Cinema, concerts, and the theatre are important for 40% of respondents. Thirty six per cent said they used Sundays for catching up with work – a sign of the times! Of course, many people will be involved in more than one activity. All in all, a picture of an active village interested in many different things.

Epilogue

We have deliberately not called this section "Conclusion" since a Village Appraisal is a starting point, not an end in itself.

It was in a play (by John Mortimer, we believe) that a character remarked that "travel doesn't broaden the mind, it simply confirms one's prejudices". We hope that this report has done a little more than that. Before it found its way into print it had two immediate practical benefits. We were able to provide "hard" statistics on the distribution of house location in the village to the organisers of the "Save Our Star" campaign. Second, data from both the Youth and Main Questionnaires on Sport and Leisure activity was passed to the Committee of the newly-born Sports Club. In both instances, the figures contribute valuable backup and support.

However, we are conscious of shortcomings. Since the Steering Group started work in May of last year our Post Office has closed, and the Star Inn (at the time of writing) is the subject of a "Change of Use" Application. Although one section (of the Questionnaire) looked at the use and contribution of our Post Office we neglected to test views on the contribution made to community life by our pubs. In the light of our experience we have asked Suffolk ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England) to advise those villages undertaking an Appraisal to include a section on pubs and inns.

As we said in the introduction, it is up to villagers to decide how they wish to use the information produced by the survey. Similarly local authorities and other statutory bodies may find the report of use when preparing or reviewing local plans or considering policy.
