Swings and Roundabouts

It is well known that the playground equipment is reaching the end of useful life and both ROSPA reports and the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire identified the need for new and enhanced facilities. Following on from the groundwork done by Alison Alder and Wil Harvey and previous articles in *The Warbler*, a subgroup has been formed to plan and implement a phased programme of development both on the existing playground and the far field sports area near the skate park.

The first phase will be a total revamp of the playground with the aim of making it the best facilities for young people in the area.

The intention is to try to complete this during 2016 and this may cost up to about £30000 which should come from a variety of local authority funds and grants, other grants and fund raising. We have been pledged about £4000 from local Authority grants, have applied for £8000 from Section 106 (planning permission) sources and are fortunate and grateful to have received a gift of £2500 from the Pepyn and Lessey charity.

However, as this is a whole community project, it would be really good if the people and organisations of Wenhaston and Mells put their support behind this in any way that they can.

Wine Wisdom for February.

I know that everyone who enjoys drinking wine is aware that wines made from the same variety of grape can taste very differently depending on where the wine was made and the inclination/skill of the winemaker. This thought came to mind when tasting the local Co-op's Craigmoor Shiraz from New South Wales, Australia. This is a lighter (13.5%), brighter style of shiraz rather than the usual Australian blockbuster. If your taste is for the denser, chocolatey Barossa Valley or McLaren Vale style then Craigmoor is not for you. However, for many people it will provide a refreshing change. Try with pork or lamb chops. It is also kind to post-Christmas budgets at about £6. (It's on offer at the time of writing).

If something between the two styles mentioned above is needed then a Syrah (the French name for Shiraz) from Southern France may fit the bill – try Baron de Badassiere, Pays d'Oc, from Blyth Valley Wines (online or 478687). About £8. Happy New Year! *Bernard Orme*

Southwold Railway Trust Report, January 2016

The Trust is both impressed and thankful that so many volunteers have given their time and energy to our cause in the last six months – and that still more active members are joining us. Undeterred by cold or wet, or even by the unrelenting and physically draining work, the team (within which the age gap between oldest and youngest is almost sixty years) continue to arrive to work, go home exhausted, and yet turn up again two or three days later. Such dedication should be rewarded.

It seems appropriate at this stage to clarify some things about the Trust, not all of which may be known in Wenhaston. The Trust is a registered Charity, No 1117041, which means that its Charitable Statement, below, has been recognised by the Charity Commission as appropriate:

“The Southwold Railway Trust exists to promote awareness of the heritage of the old Southwold Railway which closed in 1929, preserve any remaining artefacts of the railway, and instigate re-instatement of the railway as a local community and public amenity connecting Southwold to the main line railway at Halesworth.”

The 378 members elect their Board of Trustees to carry out the aims of the Trust. Anyone can join (provided that they agree with the Statement and Aims of the Trust), all are welcome, and local residents are particularly encouraged. Organisations and groups can also join as “Group Members”.

In 2016, great things are expected of the organisation. This year’s successful efforts to increase membership will continue. Manufacture and assembly of steam locomotive “Blyth” will ramp up. The Victorian Heritage Train project, of which the loco is a part, is already well on the way, with completion of at least one replica three-foot-gauge 1879 wagon planned for this year. Stewardship of Trust land at Wenhaston will continue, and more events, like the successful Charity Open Day in July 2015, will showcase the volunteers’ work.



Wenhaston Gardeners January 2016 report

'How many of you grow vegetables?' was the question posed by Ric Staines at the beginning of his talk "Fork to Fork". He was very impressed by the number of people who did but less so by the response to 'Have you planned your vegetable garden?' Questions to ask before planning a scheme are: what vegetables do I like, what eats plants other than me and which ones are expensive to buy?

Ric is very keen on biodynamics. The vegetable plot should run north to south and the plants east to west so that they get the most benefit from the sun, sowing different seeds on different days. Companion planting was also recommended, onions with carrots should help discourage carrot fly. It is said that the fly can smell carrots from 2 miles away, however it suffers from vertigo as it won't fly any higher than 2 feet!

Much that biodiversity recommends sounds like country law that the 'old boys' used to preach and be scoffed at but it seems they knew a thing or two.
