Wenhaston Cinema Group

We are pleased to announce the gradual return of our local Cinema in the Village Hall on **Saturday 19th September** at **7:30pm** with a showing of **'Little Women'**. This is an American coming-of-age period drama written and directed by Greta Gerwig, a film adaptation of the 1868 novel by Louisa May Alcott. Donations can be made into our normal container at the Main Hall door. Seating will be socially distanced as per Government Guidance which will mean less seats. Our Hall size will allow for a maximum of 50 available seats, so the principle of first come first served will apply.

The usual red fabric chairs have been temporarily replaced by our older but more easily sanitised plastic chairs. As these are less

comfortable, it is recommended that attendees bring along their own seat cushion for the performance. The Bar will be open with socially distanced queueing and we would appreciate correct payments to avoid handling cash.

Whilst face coverings are not mandatory for our particular venue, I believe the system adopted by Leiston Cinema offers a pragmatic approach for minimizing the risk to our more vulnerable people. This means wearing a face covering on entry to, and exit from the Hall, queueing at the Bar and visiting the toilet but once seated it may be removed.

Subject to any further Government restrictions, and demand of course, we would hope to be able to resume 'normal service' of both Saturday and Thursday evening film nights in the coming months. Watch for future announcements on the Village Hall car park board.

Village Hall news

The Management Committee held the first full meeting for five months on Monday 10th August. This followed the easing of restrictions and the government advice that strict shielding measures for some had been lifted as the rates of transmission of coronavirus (COVID-19) in the community have fallen significantly.

A small group from the Committee have been meeting outside to consider all the Government advice and actions we have to adhere to before the hall is able to re-open. Our Café team and Cinema team have also been busy drawing up plans for how they can safely re-start. The Men's Breakfast team are considering how they can get back to serving up a Full English breakfast once a month. At our meeting these documents and plans were all agreed. Volunteers are making other things we will need to have in place. We have now agreed that the Village Hall can partially re-open with effect from Tuesday 1st September. This is subject to Government guidance and is in accordance with the COVID-19 regulations which are all subject to change at short notice.

All our regular hirers will have already been contacted with the necessary documentation to enable us to welcome hall hirers back to the hall. The café and cinema will re-start but we will be unable to start Kurling or the monthly Craft Markets yet due to the difficulties in social distancing, other issues and managing the numbers. Other large events will also be impossible to host and all new enquiries will be reviewed on an individual basis by the full Committee to ensure we are meeting Government guidelines.

We very much look forward to welcoming hall hirers back to the Village Hall. Please help us to keep everyone safe by following the guidelines given for your individual activities by the organisers, so that one-way systems are observed which don't conflict with the Post Office users and that social distancing and hygiene requirements are followed.

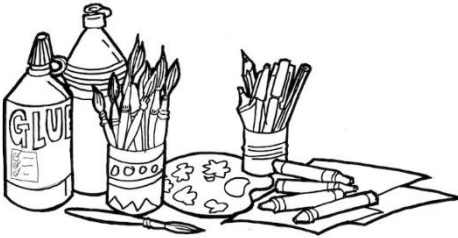
Coming Soon.....

Pottering with Poppy

We have set out in the late afternoon and come to Westleton Heath and it seems as if we are the only ones here. It is very quiet; the air is mild and it is good to be out. We walk along our chosen track and Poppy is very busy catching up with all the smells. There is a clearing on our left,

made some time ago when they brought the Dartmoor ponies to graze the area but it now seems to be being left to revert to heath. The ground cover is very different as plants recolonise the sandy gravel. Everything is small and low growing. There is Common Centaury, Self-heal, Hare's-foot

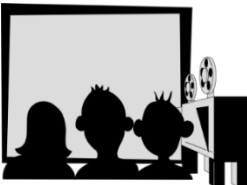
Clover and a St John's wort and all-around Wood Sage is in flower and further on it is intermingling with the Bell Heather which is in full bloom.

The path narrows and gets very sandy and as the slope descends there are lots of small mounds of freshly raised soil. I guess they are the work of solitary wasps, living in solitary burrows but together in a small colony and just a little further on I spot two in their burrow entrances excavating the soil.

On down the track I am looking, listening and hoping to see Dartford Warbler. There was a family here when we came last. I stop and listen but nothing. There is a Wren singing in the distance and a Chiffchaff. Crows and Rooks fly over but nothing else.

The heath is wide open now apart from the odd conifer and Silver Birch and I stand again to listen so that there are no distractions to my hearing of rustling jacket or my foot fall. I hear and see, almost at the same instant a male Stone Chat sitting on top of a tiny oak sapling and then another, a juvenile. There are also two small, dark, long tailed birds probably my elusive Dartford Warbles but they are not cooperating and giving me a good view. Just little glimpses as they move about the gorse bushes. In the distance a Yellow Hammer is singing. Poppy wonders what on earth all this waiting around is about and we walk on.
