## Wenhaston Save Our Swifts Action Group Latest news!

Swifts are flying around in 'screaming parties' in various places including along Chapel Lane, around Low farm, and near the Church Rooms. We have definite reports of nesting behaviour at The Star Inn, in Back Road, and here at Marsh Cottage.

Do let me know if you see swifts entering either under roof tiles or into a swift nesting box. The boxes and callers at St Peters church, the Village Hall and at the school are all ready and calling in the early evenings and mornings, and we hope that swifts will take up residence soon. Don't forget about the Swift Pint walk on 2nd July, starting 6pm at the village hall car park, and ending at the Star Inn. All are welcome, even if you can only come for a while.

Members of the swift group will be recording the numbers of swifts flying over the village in July. I will report back at the end of the summer.

Do let some of your grass grow long and try to grow flowers that attract insects. Try not to use insecticides. This will help build up

supplies of the insects that swifts and their babies feed on.

Keep an eye out for swifts, and also their migratory cousins, the swallows and house martins, and of course also sand martins nesting at the sand pit on Blackheath.

A new 'swifts live here' tile has been made by Smoke and Fire at Darsham, pictured right. Please contact me via e mail if you have swifts living on your premises and you would like to buy one (£15 each) to display. Enjoy the sights of summer in our lovely village!

## If you go down to the woods today...

Warmer weather has reached Blyth Woods - and all of us - at last. The bluebells may have faded with spring's end but there are other surprises to be found in the summer-green trees of Vicarage Grove. One of our Group heard the notes of a rare Golden Oriole's song a month ago, in the morning, just a little after the dawn chorus. You hardly ever see these exotic, secretive birds, merely a flash of a bright yellow body among the trees' high canopy. Their song is a pure, rich, fluting whistle, with a questioning note. They are migrating birds and, sadly, it was probably on its way past us to Europe and then on to winter in central or southern Africa. But for one fleeting instance, it brought magic.

However, we never forget our other common but much loved species. We put up twelve nesting boxes in Grove Piece and eleven have been used. The good news is that nine of these have fledged successful broods of blue and great tits. The nesting boxes put up by the Commons Group in Vicarage Grove have also been very successful,



and by the time of the next issue we may have news about a rare plant species identified in Malster's Pond. Watch this space!

## **Our Village Football Club**

When I chatted to Dougie Canham (Manager) about the life and times of Wenhaston United Football Club, I was surprised to hear the earliest mention of football in Wenhaston was in 1644; but perhaps I shouldn't have been - hasn't football always been part of English village life? Are there old records of teams and matches?

Dougie: 'Yes, written records from 1898, with gaps here and there. I've been keeping a record since I started playing in 1983. If you're interested, you should read the Green Book' (a fascinating account of village football in Wenhaston and surrounding villages written by Andrew Jackson in 1993)

How is the Club getting on these days?

Dougie: 'Well, let's start with the facilities. We've got a good ground right in the middle of the village, and a pretty good clubhouse, which we've been recently upgrading....... It's important to note that the Club are the 'custodians' of the clubhouse and pitch, and we welcome other groups to use them for playing and training. We have played in the Suffolk & Ipswich League, Junior Division 1 for the last 4 years.... How many of the players are from the village?

Dougie: 'Only a couple; a few years ago we had 10 from Wenhaston. These days there are so many other things going on competing for their time, and many lads move on and away from the village....... We have players from Yoxford, Halesworth, and even coming down from Lowestoft!

What makes a village football team like Wenhaston 'tick'?

Dougie: 'It's important to keep the spirit of village football going, and make sure it gives continuity from generation to generation.'

When does the season start?

Dougie: 'We kick off with pre-season friendlies – at home on July 16, 30, August 6<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>'
