#### **Swift Ringing in Wenhaston**



It has been wonderful to see the screaming parties of swifts racing round the roof tops and feeding high in the fading light of summer evenings.

Another month and they will leave us for their winter home and we will again eagerly await their return next year.

As part of the Swift Action Group in Wenhaston, we have had swift boxes on our NE facing gable end for four years now and this year is the first year we have confirmed breeding swifts in one of our two boxes.

We were fortunate to have Alan Miller, a licensed ringer for the BTO British Trust for Ornithology, come round to ring the young swifts and this is about the third successful box that Alan has ringed this year in Wenhaston. At first, we thought we had 3 young, but once bagged and the ringing begun, it was evident that one was an adult, which had been roosting with its young, as it was much darker and feistier that its chicks, though with Alan's expert touch it soon quietened down.



Alan thought they were possibly only about a week away from fledging and showed us how the flight feathers were almost fully grown. Up close their feet are very claw like and facially they reminded me of a nightjar. Only one youngster made a fuss and squealed a little. Once ringed, fiddly but Alan tells us easy,it was then weighed (head first in a vitamin pot). One youngster weighed 54 grams, the other slightly smaller at 51 grams. Interestingly the adult only weighed 44 grams, which Alan says is quite normal. The young before fledging, weigh more than the adults because, just before they fledge, the adults stop feeding, and so the young are forced to leave the nest and start feeding for thems, but they have a fat reserve to carry them over as they learn to hunt for themselves. The adult's wing measured 177mm.

The leg rings are numbered and carry the address of The British Museum. We found the ringing session fascinating and thank Alan for his expertise and time.


Raising funds for Village Hall maintenance

#### **Defibrillator Training Could Save Lives**

The recent provision of a defibrillator by the Parish Council to the

sports-field pavilion, prompted the need for training to those running village activities who may need to employ it. On 30<sup>th</sup> June some thirty-five people, representing the Football Club, Bowls Club, the Tennis Club, the Village Hall Management Committee and the Parish Council, attended the meeting to hear Simon Drewitt, Training Officer, East Coast Community Healthcare, explain what to do if faced with someone in cardiac arrest, or who is having a heart attack. The defibrillator is a mobile box and once taken from its wall-mounted storage cabinet and placed by the person in distress, a recorded voice provides clear and definitive instructions on how to carry out the procedure. This includes the strategic placing of pads on the person's chest and providing an electric shock to encourage the heart to reregulate, or even restart. Armed with a dummy torso, Mr. Drewitt also demonstrated the benefits of CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) which involves strong, rapid pushes to the chest.

The Parish Council now supports two defibrillators in the village. The installation at the village hall was purchased some years' ago and is regularly checked by a member of the Village Hall Management Committee. A Bowls Club volunteer has agreed to monitor the defibrillator at the sports field.
