### WEA Spring Course in Wenhaston: Cinema and Religion

The Wenhaston Branch of the WEA will burst back into action with the Spring 2023 term. Our course will be 'Cinema and Religion' and is described by our tutor, David Sharp, as follows:

"Since the invention of 'movies', believers have seen the potential of the screen to document, envisage and persuade the viewer of the importance of a certain religious way of life. Cecil B. DeMille's biblical blockbusters have given way to more sophisticated, sympathetic as well as sceptical perspectives on religion by directors such as Dreyer, Passolini, Weir and Scorcese.

Films will be grouped by major traditions: Buddhism, Christianity, Judaism, New Age and will raise different questions about religion and spirituality. Films chosen will generally be of a serious nature, well received by critics and rarely biblical blockbusters, horror, historical costume drama, comedies or feel-good films.

Students may like to watch the following films in preparation: 'Chariots of Fire', 'Silence', 'Yentl', 'The Seventh Seal', 'Dead Man Walking', 'Little Buddha', 'The Wicker Man', 'My Name is Khan'. You may also like to dip into books such as 'Religion and Film' by Melanie Wright and 'Luminous' by Mike King."

The course comprises 7x2 hour sessions starting at 10am on Friday, 3<sup>rd</sup> February at Wenhaston Village Hall. A break for half term falls on Friday, 17<sup>th</sup> February and the last session will be on Friday, 24<sup>th</sup> March. ### **Blackheath Clearance**

Following the major fire on Blackheath in September of last year work will commence in the next few weeks to clear the burnt gorse from the western end of the common. This will be carried out mechanically by contractors employed by Suffolk Wildlife Trust. Please keep well away from the machinery when the work is taking place.

> > They will also carry out the next stage of scraping off the gorse layer at the eastern end of the common which was started in 2022, and also cut a firebreak in the large stand of tall gorse adjoining that area to try to reduce so far as possible the risk of fire spreading through to properties nearby. Again please keep well away from the machinery while the work is taking place.

### **Wenhaston Allotments**

In mid-November, the committee guiding the Wenhaston Allotment and Leisure Gardeners' Association (WALGA) decided reluctantly to disband after the retirement of some key members. Management of the allotments was passed immediately to the Parish Council which owns the land on behalf of the residents of the village. Work is ongoing to re-establish a small management team of gardening enthusiasts to ensure that 'business will continue as usual', early in 2023. The allotments feature fourteen separate plots and current plot holders are reassured that their plots are secure if they wish to continue. Anyone on the waiting list will be invited to join as plots become available and in chronological order. The new group will be called the Wenhaston Allotment Association (WAA) and new tenancy agreements are already being drawn up. A fresh constitution has also

been written to ensure that the allotment area becomes once again a pleasant and fruitful experience for plot holders.

The inaugural meeting of the WAA will be held at Wenhaston Village Hall on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2023 at 2pm.

The Home Library service is there for anyone who loves to read but can't get to the library.

The Home Library Service is run by volunteers who pick up books, audio books or DVDs from the library and take them to customers in their own home. The service provides a lifeline for many older and disabled people across Suffolk who also benefit from the regular social interaction too.

Volunteers can visit private homes or care homes and operate within COVID guidelines to keep everyone safe. All volunteers have been through an application, reference and DBS checking process and a training programme.
