Christian Aid Week 2023

As I write, rain seems to have poured down for days and though we welcome it after last year's lengthy droughts, we can get a little tired of it after a while. I say this because Christian Aid Week 2023 is almost upon us. And even if we are experiencing extremes these days, they pale in contrast with what other countries suffer as climate change extends its grip.

This year Christian Aid week focuses on Malawi, a land-locked country in southern Africa bordered by Zambia, Mozambique and Tanzania. Like many countries it is experiencing ever rising costs of food, fuel, fertiliser and school fees, the last two important in a largely crop growing country and where, like many African countries, parents must fork out for basic school fees.

Last year Malawi's harvest failed dramatically, only to be followed by cyclone Freddy lasting 34 days, which washed away what meagre crops there were. Over 500 000 people were displaced while hundreds lost their lives. Malawi is still struggling to get back on its feet.



Blyth Woods' Annual Meeting

Our Annual Meeting, at which everyone is welcome, will take place on Thursday, 25th May at 7 p.m. in Wenhaston Village Hall. Entrance is free and refreshments will be provided.

The talk, with slides, will be on 'Wilder Wenhaston 2023'. This will bring you up to date on what has happened so far and how you can be part of it - both in very simple ways, such as leaving an area of your lawn unmown for wild flowers, butterflies and bees to flourish, or by joining in our activities, such as planting more trees, more vital than ever in a time of climate change.

So much has been achieved in the past year since this important enterprise started: do come and hear all about it!

Grove Piece Copse: Pond Restoration

The Copse is the small triangular piece of woodland adjoining Grove Piece on its northern border. Last month you may have seen a digger



there, clearing the pond. This work is now completed and, in the photographs, you can see how the pond looked before and after. An army of alexanders are thrusting up by the hedge in Malster's Little Field. By the

time you read this, we hope to have dealt with them before they flower and take over the area, taking light and water from the new trees planted there. Once a medieval pot plant, they have become all too invasive everywhere. Meanwhile, on 22nd April a work party undertook general maintenance through Grove Woods, doing jobs such as weeding tree protective tubes or removing them where they had been outgrown.

Along the path to Vicarage Grove from the Bramfield Road the delicate white flowers of blackthorn are out, to be followed by hawthorn blossom, and in Vicarage Grove you can see greater stitchwort and the glossy yellow stars of celandine now. Spring is here at last!
