## Wenhaston Tennis Club

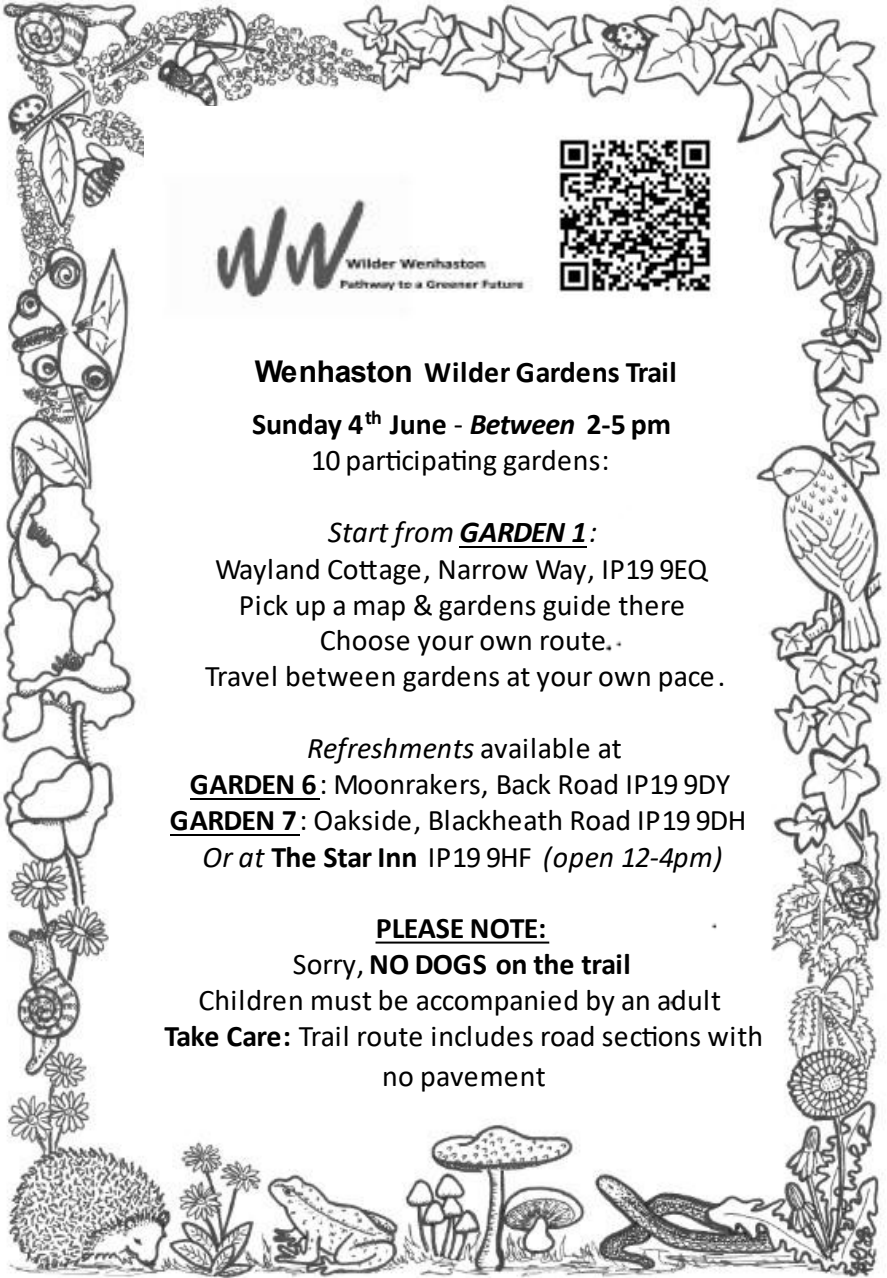


The Wenhaston Tennis Club is open to all abilities and new members are most welcome (fees available on request). We have approximately 17 members and ladies play on

## Swift Pint Walk Saturday 8th July



The Wenhaston Save our Swift Action Group is happy to announce that our swifts have begun to return to their homes in the village and the swift flag at St Peters churchyard is flying again.

The first sighting of birds flying over the village was reported on 28th April and the first 'camera confirmed' arrival into a swift box in Back Road was seen on 7th May.

We will be holding our annual Swift Pint walk on 8th July, starting at 6pm in the village hall car park, and finishing at the Star Inn from 8pm onwards, where we will enjoy watching the swifts who reside there swooping and screaming as we take refreshment. Alan Miller will lead the walk and may be able to show us views of the nesting swifts in his boxes on camera.

All are welcome for this enjoyable walk around the village. Just turn up! There will be a chance to discuss any queries and thoughts about continuing to support habitats for swifts and other birds such as swallows and house martins in the village as we walk.

Thank you to villagers who have been in contact about installing swift boxes and callers. We now have two new potential homes for swifts' thanks to enthusiastic householders who have got ready for the season with newly installed boxes and callers. Two extra boxes have also been supplied by the group for installation at the primary school, to add to the pre-existing box and caller.

The calling systems which play the sound of swifts are an important part of attracting swifts looking for a new nest site. Studies have shown that swifts searching for a home are drawn in towards the recorded sound of swifts calling and will then investigate the nest box, often by 'banging' as they fly close by. The callers are set to switch on usually for short periods of time morning and night, and can be played quietly or for variable times, depending on what the human residents prefer! There are several examples in the village of swifts now nesting in new boxes, after the callers have been playing during the summer for 2 years or so. We have been playing swift calls in summer for three years from the school, church tower and the village hall. We are hoping that this may be the year the swifts will find homes there!

## Wenhaston's Ukraine Fundraiser – One Year On

Just over a year ago we held a fundraising event for Ukraine in the Village Hall - the Black Deek Band and friends plus sales of donated art-work, crafts and more – and raised more than £3000 over the weekend. But the best was yet to come: do you remember the woven wall-hanging (a Sprang weaving) that we sent to auction (at Sworders Fine Art, who generously waived the seller's commission) and which went for a staggering **£20,000**? **The eventual total was just short of £25,000.** Now, a year on, I'm delighted to tell you what the money was spent on, courtesy of our liaison, Dr Monika McNeill.

The main beneficiary has been the Children's Hospital in Lviv Oblast, in the Ukraine.

The Director is Igor Kozankevych, who has been doing an incredible job there under trying conditions looking after about 300 people, including war victim patients and their sick family members.



Our fundraising purchased a **large 80kW power generator** last November, plus **car batteries** for hospital vehicles. Previously they had only 2-3 hours of electricity every 24 hours, and the generator now powers large parts of the hospital continuously.



In Lublin, Poland, our donation provided basic but vital **medical equipment** for treating Ukrainian refugees sheltered in hotels and hostels.

And under the supervision of psychologist Prof. Julia

Gorbaniuk, who has been working with war-traumatised children since the invasion of the Crimea in 2014, our funds were used to help equip a 'Mother & Child' Centre for traumatised children fleeing over the border (often on their own), with resources for children's play rooms - about eighty mums and children arrived last September.



The final part of the funds bought some appliances that were urgently needed in the Centre (kettles, electric hobs, hair dryers, etc.)

It is very gratifying to see the real practical difference that Wenhaston's fundraising has made!
