The children have learnt valuable skills including measuring and ,marking out, cutting and shaping, assembling and of course finishing and decorating. They have leant the importance of things such as accuracy when attempting things such as mitre cuts and of course safety when handling tools.



We were lucky enough to have a visit from local photographer Molly of MollyRuby Photography come to do a photoshoot of the children with their friends, so that they have a lovely picture to put in the frame too. This has proven to be another great hands on piece of practical learning for all involved.

### **A Blyth Woods Summer**

Like everyone in Wenhaston, the Blyth Woods group faced the recordbreaking heat and drought of June, the thunder and torrents of early July and the fierce gales that followed and blew branches and twigs down into our gardens. Now we wait to see what August will bring!

Meanwhile, in Vicarage Grove the Tawny Owlets have fledged and one has been ringed. In Grove Piece the pond has refilled after our last rainstorm and the saplings have sprung up, so that it is now beginning to look like a true young wood, with oak, ash, hornbeam, hawthorn and field maple all flourishing.

We held our Blyth Woods Friends' Picnic and Bioblitz here on 8<sup>th</sup> July and the Friends' hard work hunting out and identifying species of plants, insects and animals was rewarded by a delicious lunch of chilled soup, sandwiches, cakes and strawberries. As always, the results of the search were interesting, in particular the amount of life we found in the newly restored pond in the Copse in Grove Piece. Despite being buried under a metre and a half of silt, there had been plenty of seed lying dormant and we spotted soft hornwort now growing. We also found young smooth newts, which means they have already bred this year. Several species of dragon and damsel flies are laying eggs. The pond is coming to life!

The meadow grass in Malster's Little Field will be cut shortly and we have planned an evening work party to rake it on **10**<sup>th</sup> **August at 6 p.m.**, with a break for refreshments halfway through. Do come and join in. Your help would be greatly appreciated (rakes will be available) and they are always great social occasions.

We are replacing the existing interpretation board at the Vicarage Grove end of Grove Piece. The new one will show up-to-date information about Grove Piece and photographs of what can be seen there. We are arranging for separate signs saying 'Grove Woods' to stand at the start of the Bartholemew's Farm path and the one leading from Bramfield Road. This is to help those who don't know how to reach Grove Woods, or, indeed, that the name covers Vicarage Grove, Grove Piece and Malster's Little Field. At the moment along the Bramfield path with its ancient hedge on one side and the bean field on the other, the pink clover is out, humming with bees, and there are pink-white bramble flowers and daisies. It is a beautiful walk, with the cool shade of Vicarage Grove at the end to welcome you.

The programme devised by Marie Rolfe with Wenhaston Primary School has continued over the summer term, with the Teddy Bears' Picnic in Vicarage Grove for the Reception class on 9<sup>th</sup> of June (marmalade sandwiches and strawberries, after they had found the hidden teddies!) and a creative writing session for Years 5 and 6 (Oaks) on 12<sup>th</sup>.



Samples of the children's work were displayed on the boards at the Village Show. On 26<sup>th</sup> June Years 1 and 2 (Seedlings) explored Merton Wood and the children were excited to see trees planted by school children thirty years ago. We hope that some of these children will be looking after Grove Woods in the future.

We had two tables at the Wenhaston Village Show on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> July, with displays and our lovely new notelet cards on sale, and were delighted to talk to people about what we do. For anyone needing further information, please visit our website below.
