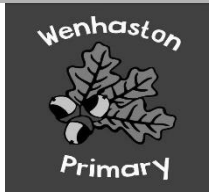
## Tennis in Wenhaston

### LIN CARTER

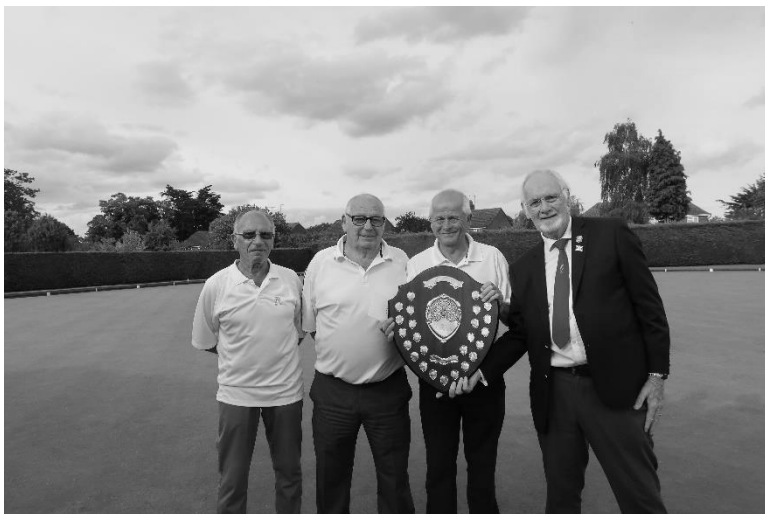

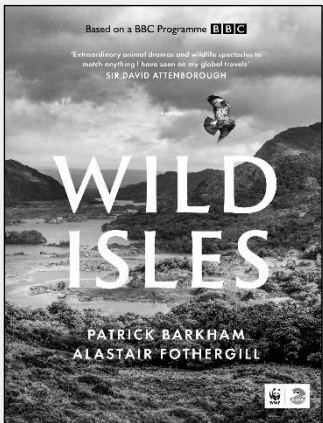

## **Works to the Church Roof**

Substantial works to repair St Peter's Church have recently been completed by contractors instructed by the PCC. The main focus of the works was to retile the south side of the chancel roof, where the old clay tiles had been badly damaged by frost so that there was a danger of the roof not being watertight. Repairs have also been carried out to the eaves and soffits of the main building and porch, together with the gutters and downpipes.

Total cost was in excess of £26,000.00, and we are grateful for the support of the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust for their contribution towards the cost, together with the Allchurches Trust and Scarfe Trust. We are also grateful to the contractors LA Hurrell Ltd for the quality of the work undertaken, and care to ensure the building was not damaged while the works were taking place.

## **Monitoring Our Waterways For Pollution**

The latest project to be started by Wilder Wenhaston is to look at the state of our local river and streams. One of the aims is to monitor in a scientific way the various pollutants in our local rivers and streams and look at ways to reduce their impacts. Anglian Water have given us equipment so that we can produce accurate data to identify and report sources of specific pollutants.

Much of the recent press relating to the state of our rivers has focussed on the poor efficiency of our antiquated sewage works, but a vast majority were built forty or fifty years ago, when the population was smaller, and the amount of chemicals that were used were far less, and so we can all help the situation by thinking about what we flush down our drains and reduce our individual impact.

For instance, following on from a discussion at the Annual Parish meeting regarding the impact of flea and tick treatments for cats and

dogs when they enter the natural water environment, the following research has revealed some startling facts.

Imperial College London's Grantham Institute published a briefing in March on the environmental impact of pet parasiticides (**Preston – Allen et al 2023**). Not surprisingly, flea and tick treatments for cats and dogs include some potent insecticides, mainly imidacloprid (a neonicotinoid), and fipronil. These chemicals are banned for use in agriculture and previous thought was that, by comparison, the quantity used in the pet trade was insignificant. However new data has



shown these chemicals are entering our rivers and ponds at quantities that will kill insect larvae, and so impact the very bottom of the food chain.

These chemicals are used on a large proportion of the UK's 25 million dogs and cats and, for example, the treatment for a large dog is enough to

kill several million bees. Therefore, dogs swimming in ponds and rivers are a real threat to the wider environment, along with the washing of pet bedding. Even hand washing is thought to be one of the main ways these chemicals are entering our aquatic systems.

Pet owners, please talk to your vets, or check online, as there are alternative treatments available that are much safer and friendlier. Also consider treating only when needed rather than as a precaution. Locally Blyth Woods and several local landowners have spent many thousands of pounds restoring ponds for the benefit of wildlife and the environment, so please refrain from letting your pets swim in these waters. We want future generations to still enjoy seeing dragonflies and damselflies dancing above the water surface.

## Wenhaston Swift News

As I write (6th August),the swifts have mostly left the village and are returning to their winter homes in Central and Southern Africa. A keen eyed villager first spotted a flying swift over the village this year on 28th April, and we hoisted the swift flag at the churchyard the next day. Alan saw a swift enter one of his swift nest boxes on 7th May, swifts were seen entering nests under our pan tiles at Marsh Cottage

on 21st May, and Richard and Jan reported occupation of their box on 28th May.

The numbers of swifts flying over the village as part of exuberant screaming parties increased as summer progressed, giving joyful moments to Wenhaston residents.

Our Swift Pint walk on 8th July was an enjoyable event held in good weather. Seventeen of us walked around visiting places with known nest sites, and we observed nesting swifts coming and going, plus numerous screaming parties of swooping swifts over Back Road, Cole's Hill, and over the pub where we had a convivial end to the walk. At one point a maximum of 21 birds flew over our heads in the Star Inn garden. The RSPB Swiftmapper website has been updated (visit [swiftmapper.org.uk](http://swiftmapper.org.uk) and zoom in to find Wenhaston). I have recorded installed boxes, observed nest sites, and the screaming parties we observed on the walk.

The two counts carried out on 7th and 27th of July showed very similar numbers to last year, which is reassuring after the fears about bird flu and unusual weather patterns. One of the most exciting pieces of news was that a nesting bird



ringed by Alan last year was identified back in the same nest box while he was ringing the bird's new brood recently. It really is quite awe inspiring that these small birds can navigate with such a strong homing instinct. That is why we must all try to do what we can to keep our habitats productive for swifts (and other migratory birds), and to continue to offer homes for them when they return.

A total of 68 species were identified with the help of some local experts, detailed guidebooks and the Suffolk Moth group website ([Suffolk Moths - The macro and micro moths of Suffolk.](#))

The independent judges stated the exhibits were of a high quality and extremely varied.



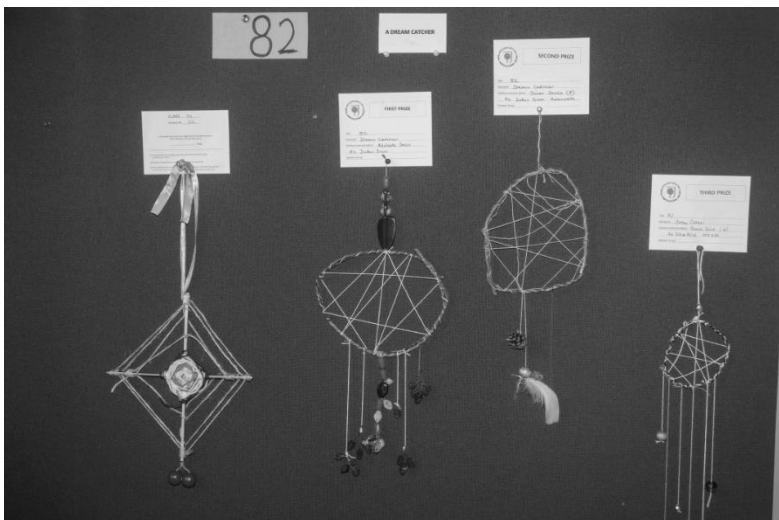
