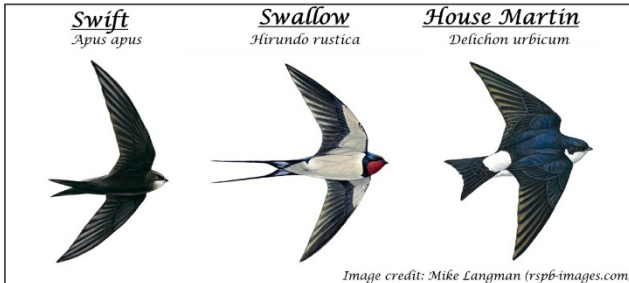

SAGA CHAPTER 2 (15)

Swifts, Swallows and Martins

Swifts, swallows, house and sand martins all start migrate to Southern Africa this month. Swift screaming parties have swooped through our village, feeding low and high on insects which in turn are feeding from our garden plants and ponds.

How to tell the difference



Sand martins nest on Blackheath, but unlike house martins, sand martin's have brown backs.

The Swift Group record numbers of swifts and their nest sites seen in the village, annually. Have you noticed any swift, swallows or house martins nesting at your house.

What to do in your garden over winter to prepare for their return in April/May 2025.

Create a pond or wet area with a bog garden, providing a muddy area for swallows and house martins to swoop down to collect mud for building nests. Grow insect-friendly plants.

Identify areas below roof line suitable to fix swift nest boxes. House martins build mud nests in the eaves but will use artificial nest boxes, while swallows nest in outbuildings and need clear points of entry.

Why not come along and help rake up the mown grasses in Grove Woods on **Monday, 5th August** at 6 p.m.? Rakes provided and we'd love your help.

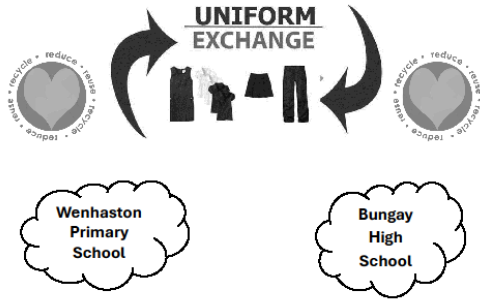

Raking hay while the sun shines ...

... Or in this case, during a light drizzle, one recent July day in Wenhaston Churchyard. I have really enjoyed my first year of volunteering for **Wenhaston Commons Group (WCG)**, pitching in to help with a range of jobs and getting to know the local landscape and wildlife. There's been gorse and bracken clearing and heather brash-spreading, to encourage the rare and beautiful silver-studded blue butterflies who live on the heath; planting native saplings for improved habitat and flood mitigation; sand-clearing to improve the (also rare) sand martins' nests, foot-path maintaining; debris-moving – and anything else that needs doing.

We've lived in Wenhaston for five years and feel increasingly lucky to be part of such a hotbed of environmental activity! As we live alongside one of the five commons in Wenhaston, it's been great to get involved in this community and to help look after our neighbourhood. I have learnt so much through working with other like-minded volunteers, and also enjoyed the bird-watching walk led by the expert Alan Miller and the bring and share lunch at Heather Phillips'. There's a moth morning coming up soon ...

WCG working parties are usually on Sunday or Tuesday mornings, mainly from September to March. No previous experience or super-fitness is necessary, just a willingness to join in for an hour or two, when you can make it. Tools and gloves are provided. Family Summer Wildlife Challenge



*See it - Spot something: a butterfly, bug, bird, a reptile
Name it - Find out what it's called.
Love it - Just enjoy watching it.*

Getting out into nature is good for us. There is so much to see and discover, and most of it is free. Engaging with the natural world can be calming and is great for physical and mental health. It can also give children and young people a break from social media and gaming.

Here are five activities you could do with your family over the summer holidays. We would love it if you could tell us how you get on: drawings, photos or a few notes can be left in St Peter's Church, Wenhamston. We will display them in the church during September, which is Creationtide, a time when the church celebrates the natural world. (There will be prizes for the best entries. Please write your child's name, age and a contact number on your contribution).

Challenge 1: Can you spot three different butterflies? It's best to do this on a sunny day between 9am and 5pm. (More information about butterflies will be available in St Peter's Wenhamston during the holidays.)

Challenge 2: Visit a local nature reserve. Suffolk Wildlife Trust has two local sites which are free: Hen Reedbeds (IP18 6SH) on the way to Southwold and Carlton Marshes (NR33 8HU) on the outskirts of Lowestoft. RSPB Minemere (IP17 3BY) charges £9 for adult non-members but children are free.

Challenge 3: Can you spend 10 minutes lying down and looking at the clouds or 10 minutes sitting in long grass or another wild area (churchyards are great for this) without talking or looking at your phone. What do you see?

Challenge 4: Find something wild in a street, carpark or another built up area.

Challenge 5: On the beach, find a shell or stone you think is beautiful.

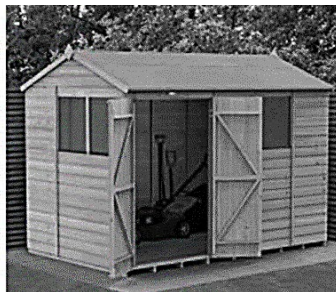
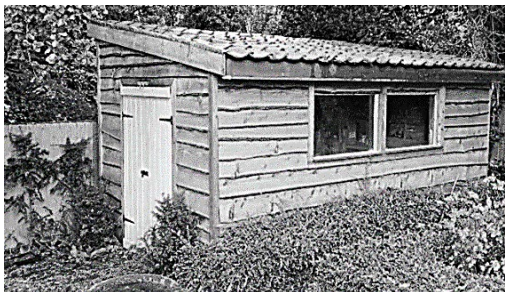

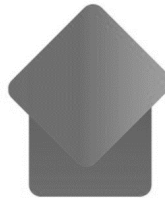
