Wilder Garden Hints and Tips for December

This is our final page of Wilder Gardens and ponds 'hints and tips'. We hope you have enjoyed reading each month's suggestions. In summer 2025, we are planning a second wilder gardens open day, together with a garden question time panel event.

Now it is deep winter, keep your garden untidy in places, with leaf piles and litter gathered by your hedges or fences and perennials cut half way – these all provide winter hibernation for wildlife like insects and mammals and reptiles or invertebrates that may be dormant.

Hedgehogs may be under leaf piles, shrubs or compost heaps. For this reason, bonfires are a danger.

If you have a holly tree, take some branches with berries for decoration, but leave some berries for the birds. Try grafting mistletoe – another bird treat.



Christmas present ideas: give membership to organisations that support wildlife examples are: Suffolk Wildlife Trust, Royal Society for the Protection of Birds, World Land Trust or the Woodland Trust. Bird nest boxes, bug hotels and hedgehog houses, wild flower seed packets for planting in spring, books about how to wild a garden, all make nice gifts for children or adults.

Name decided for Blyth Woods' new field

YOU MAY HAVE SEEN LAST MONTH'S piece in the Warbler about the acquisition by Blyth Woods of the land to the right of the path that leads from Church Lane. We wanted to research what it was originally called and thanks to



Heather Phillips, who showed us old tithe maps, it appeared as allotments and was just called 'pightle', meaning a small enclosure or paddock, sometimes enclosed by a hedge, in old Eastern-English regional dialect. For those who are wondering, it is pronounced 'pie-tle'. We have therefore decided to call it '**St Peter's Pightle**'. This name seems

appropriate, given that we are leasing the land from the church. Throughout December and January our first task in the group is to plant hedging once the land is prepared. After that there will be regular work parties open to all. This field will be an asset to the village, not just to our group, and we hope anyone will feel free to help. Dates will follow.

We had a very successful launch of this new project on 18th October, when Friends of Blyth Woods and other interested friends had a talk by Alan Miller, our Chair, followed by delicious autumnal-themed soups, puddings, cakes and cheese. Ideas for the layout of the field were enthusiastically suggested.

On the same day, the children from Acorn class went hunting for acorns to plant in their tree nursery: it is hoped these will eventually come to the new field. First, they went there and saw how it looked at the beginning of a very new project. They found eight oak seedlings, which we will pot while the field is prepared for planting.

East Suffolk Council – Councillor Update, 16th October 2024

*(The following is a précis of a report by Cllr Geoff Wakeling
to Wenhamston with Mells Parish Council)*

Twin-Stream Recycling Plan

In recognition of the prodigious waste of food nationally, a system of fast and safe disposal of unwanted food is due for launch in the spring of 2026. A new recycling bin, to be collected weekly, will provide households with a place to dispose of left-over food.

The new scheme will allow officers to iron out potential problems, such as the disposal of medical waste, nappies and cat litter, for example.

The grey/black bin collection will drop to a three-weekly collection. Research has shown that the grey/black bins contain a huge percentage of food waste and the new bin will significantly reduce the requirement for the current fortnightly collection. More details are to follow from East Suffolk Council.

Wilder Wenhaston: New Year's Day Bird Challenge

IN 2021 TWELVE TEAMS spent New Year's Day seeing how many species of birds they could see or hear within the village boundary. The winning team



recorded 53 species, ranging from marsh harriers to goldcrests.

Therefore, we have decided to run the event again open to everyone and as a fund raiser for Wilder Wenhaston with a prize for the winning team. The

rules are simple: to see or hear as many species as possible within the 24 hours of 1st January 2025. A great way to shake off a New Year hangover!

If spending all day walking or cycling around the village doesn't appeal, there is also an additional garden birdwatch challenge to see who has the most birds visiting their garden with prizes for both best adult and best children's list.

Only wild birds confidently identified by sight or sound can be counted.

The competition relies on trusting participants to honestly record only the species they see/hear, but Wilder Wenhaston reserve the right to query any rare or unseasonal sightings.

Each species is worth one point in your final scoring. There is no bonus for rarities or scarce birds.

Entry costs £5 per team (teams can consist of 1, 2 or 3 people), email wilderwenhaston@gmail.com to enter.

Winners and results will appear in the February *Warbler*.

Blyth Survey – Update

FOR THE LAST 18 MONTHS our *Wilder Wenhaston* team has finding depressingly high concentrations of the 'nutrient pollutants' *phosphate* and *nitrate* in the Blyth. For example, the (eg average *nitrate* concentration in England's rivers is **5.5mg/L** and in the Blyth (Feb-Aug this year) was **18.5** mg/L. This, and high concentrations of bacteria – notably *E. coli* – come predominantly from the sewage treatment outfalls at Halesworth and Wenhaston.

To examine effects on Blyth wildlife, we set up groups to survey birds, mammals, plants and river invertebrates. Although it's early days, there are strong signs that the range of river invertebrates (insects, worms etc) are characteristic of polluted fresh water (see November's edition of the *Wenhaston Warbler*). Plant life in also reflects pollution – eg duckweed and 'sewage fungus', and heavy growth of Himalayan Balsam which, although pretty, is an invasive species and chokes growth of native species and increases bank erosion. Too early to draw conclusions about the mammal populations (otter and water-vole), and bird life, but continued monitoring should enable us to track changes – hopefully improvements!

Any good news? Firstly, *Wilder Wenhaston* is bringing these pollution problems to the public eye, challenging Anglian Water on many specific aspects of our local waste treatment, and informing politicians about the situation. Practically, after pressure from us Anglian Water finally commissioned the phosphate removal plant at Halesworth and is installing one at Wenhaston. This has reduced phosphate levels in the Blyth with an apparent reduction in duckweed. Sadly, this leaves nitrate pollution – much harder and more expensive to remove.

Untreated sewage 'spillages' into our rivers through Combined Sewage Overflows (CSOs) have been headline news nationally, and sadly the Blyth is no exception. 2023 saw the largest number of 'spills' on record. Water companies are licensed to 'spill' only in 'extreme conditions' (good luck if you try to find a definition of that!). Recently, October 1st and 2nd saw persistent rain locally (34mm and 11mm) – heavy, but not biblical – and all the CSOs at Halesworth and Beccles poured untreated sewage into the Blyth and Waveney for *12 hours plus*. This shows that the treatment works do not have the capacity to handle the volume of sewage and run-off that is required. Expansion of new housing around Halesworth together with more frequent, heavier rainfall accompanying climate change will just exacerbate the problem. We will watch the political to-ing and fro-ing with the water companies with interest, but in the meantime *Wilder Wenhaston* is working locally to monitor the Blyth and agitate for improvement.

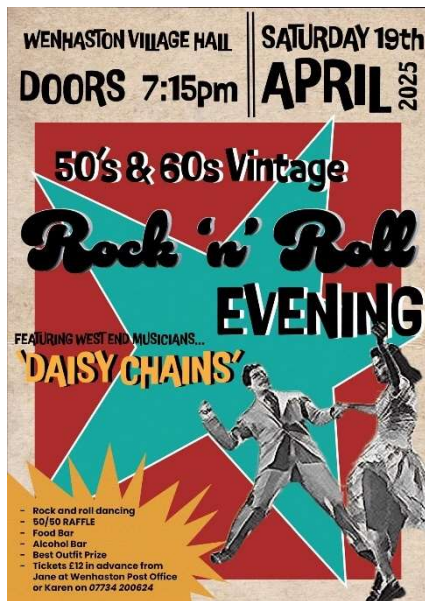
Rock 'n' Roll Extravaganza

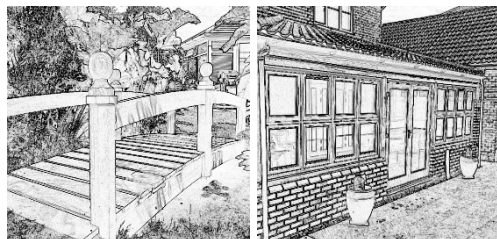
