# Let's Be Creative Again in 2025!

### Footpath Art 3

O YOU REMEMBER when we created our first Footpath Art displays during lockdown, when we were all apprehensive and bored and needed something to distract us? We built extraordinary structures out of what we could find in the surroundings of Vicarage Grove, Grove Piece and Malster's Little Field and displayed them on the paths that we all walk along while exercising our dogs, our children and ourselves.

We used twigs, leaves, pebbles, dead moss, feathers to create these weird and wonderful natural structures, often witty, sometimes beautiful, into a



treasure trail for other walkers to look out for and enjoy. We repeated it again, three years ago, Now let's do it again!

Since Christmas, the weather has been bitter, though perhaps by the time you read this, it may be milder, given our unpredictable English winters. Whatever February has in store, we all need encouragement to leave our warm homes and go out and face it. The land in winter is particularly beautiful: the leafless trees show their intricate structures,

the colours of the land are sepia, the frost outlines the furrows of the fields, the pale sun shines through mist. So while you're out walking, have a go at creating a 'sculpture' yourself, collecting anything you can find to build it along those paths through Vicarage Grove, Grove Piece and Malster's (reached – and signposted –



from the Bramfield Road). You may even find some there already!

As before, the most striking creations will appear on our website and in the next issue of the *Warbler*.

**News from St Peter's Pightle,** Blyth Woods' recent acquisition for the village: We are very grateful to the Parish Council for their generous donation. This will provide funding for the new children's nursery.

On 18<sup>th</sup> December the group planted 820 hedging trees along the far border and in the gap at the end of the path to the Bramfield Road. Quite a feat in three hours! More work was carried out on 6<sup>th</sup> January.

Regular planting work parties open to everyone will now continue every two weeks. Another will take place on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> January from 10am. All very welcome to help. No experience needed, equipment provided. To reach the Pightle, walk from Church Lane and along the path at its end. Check the next *Warbler* for further dates and times.

# New Year's Day Bird Challenge

WHAT A START TO THE NEW YEAR — it was the weather that gave the biggest challenge — 40+ mph winds and at times torrential rain. Nine teams took part with four, having looked at the weather forecast, opting to do the garden bird watch. The other five hardy souls braved the elements to scour the rest of the village for as many species as possible, before the weather made it impossible to see anything through the pouring rain.

Amazingly a total of 58 species were seen or heard, with the winning village watch team of Kate and Myles Archibald reaching a score of 52, some 18 more than the next team. Rumour has it the Landrover worked as a waterproof hide at times, but well done for persevering through the day. The garden prize was won by the Alder family, with a total of 19 species seen whilst staying dry!

No surprises in that every team recorded wood pigeon, great and blue tit and ironically the winning team missed the grey heron and bullfinches that others saw literally 100m from their home. As one team member said, they wouldn't have ventured out in such awful weather had it not been for the challenge, but such is the lure of competition.

# **Suffolk Wildlife Trust**

### The Birds of North Carolina

N A BITTERLY COLD JANUARY evening, the Southwold and Blyth group of the Suffolk Wildlife Trust gathered to hear Simon Thompson's illustrated talk on the birds of North Carolina. Originally from Suffolk, and now returned here, Simon lived for thirty years in North Carolina, observing the wildlife, travelling extensively, and running birding tours around the world, which he continues to do. This part of America is not often on the British tourist trail, and it was fascinating to learn more about it. North Carolina has three geographical areas: the Mountains, the Piedmont Plateau, and the Coastal Plain, and each area is rich in birdlife. The forested mountains are home to many species whose general names we recognise – warbler, robin, waxwing, siskin – but whose bright colours and songs are completely different. Many are migrant species from the tropics. The Northern Saw-whet Owl was a particular favourite. The lower Piedmont, with more open farmland and longleaf pines, has the grassland species and wildfowl – sparrows, woodpeckers, teal, but again with bright colourations. The Coastal Plain has huge marshlands and lakes, as well as sandy shorelines and barrier islands. The area attracts a wide variety of water fowl, such as rails, oystercatchers and plovers, and vast numbers of snow geese and other migrant seabirds. Offshore there are storm petrels and shearwaters.

It was a relaxed and enjoyable evening, and although it ended with a look at the devastation caused by Hurricane Helene in September last year, we were left with the positive message that nature will heal itself over time.

UR NEXT MEETING is on Thursday, February 13<sup>th</sup>, at 7.30pm. Anne Westover will talk about *A Life Working in Landscape*, with a passion for trees and hedgerows.
