


# Bowls Club News Dick Clarke Australian Pairs Tournament

This was played in brilliant sunshine and in the presence of Dick's widow, Jill, and their son, Dale. Organised by Chris Peck and Tom Daly, it was agreed by them that the prize money should be £40 to the winning pair, £20 to runners-up and £10 to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. This money was very generously donated by Jill and Chris.

There was also a prize draw on the day, with the proceeds going to Jill's chosen charity, CRY – 'Cardiac Risk to Young people'. This draw was in memory of Toby Chenery, a young man from Halesworth, who recently died suddenly at a young age. The
