Wenhaston Village Hall's Half-century Upgrade

Wenhaston residents are to celebrate the Village Hall's 50th anniversary on October 4th 2025. Major upgrades to toilets have been carried out in recent months, and this is being followed by total refurbishment of the kitchen and of the café, which will improve efficiency and attraction to users. It is hoped to complete the work by the summer of 2026.



Replacing a wooden hut in 1975, the Village Hall is pivotal in providing a social centre where Saturday coffee mornings, monthly craft markets, community lunches and teas are held. Indoor badminton and table-tennis sports are also major attractions, as well as regular bingo, and film evenings.

Operational funding is generated by the hire, not only to local activity groups but to organisers of other events, such as wedding or birthday celebrations.

Wenhaston Village Hall was registered as a charity in 1991, and is run by a volunteer management committee, which is already planning fund-raising events to meet the high costs involved. Donations will be gratefully accepted.

As you will be aware, Ukraine continues to be bombed by Russia, and everyday more people are left homeless and with very little. So, **a huge thank you** to everyone who has donated items to go to Ukraine with **‘Hope and Aid Direct’** in recent weeks.

I have had boxes and bags left on my doorstep. Some I know about others just turn up and I am so grateful. It’s like finding treasure! 25 banana boxes were collected in June and will now be on their way.

Our Rivers *in East Suffolk*

It's been three years since *Wilder Wenhamston* set up a River Group to investigate pollution in the Blyth and its effect on our river's wildlife, and much water (plus undesirable additions) has flowed under the bridge! We found worryingly high levels of 'nutrient pollution' (nitrates and phosphates) and unacceptable bacterial contamination, predominantly from sewage treatment effluents. Our findings are very similar to those found on other rivers in our region, and we are teaming up with the Deben Climate Centre in a 4-Rivers Project (Deben, Alde, Blyth and Waveney), with significant funding from East Suffolk Council.

Our report, published in January, has been well received by conservation groups and local politicians, many of whom were unaware of the scale of pollution, so we are building on this work to pressurize politicians, government agencies, and water companies to improve our waterways.

The 4-Rivers Project will not only give us much more collective clout, but also allow *Wilder Wenhamston* to participate in waterways improvement schemes such as runoff management and 'cutting edge' DNA analysis of *E coli* in the Blyth. These analyses of our river samples will be conducted in Suffolk University labs, and will identify toxic strains of the bacteria and – very importantly – the extent of antibiotic resistance. We will also be extending our program from the Blyth's source at Laxfield to its mouth at Southold, sampling at several sites along its whole length on a regular basis to build up a profile of the river's health.

Finishing on a bright note: phosphate in the sewage effluence from Halesworth and Wenhamston sewage treatment works has fallen dramatically, following installation of phosphate removal equipment by Anglian Water. One down, dozens to go...
