perational funding is generated by the hire, not only to local activity groups but to organisers of other events, such as wedding or birthday celebrations.



I already have a copy of a book which was written by Jessie Ellis.

My great-grandparents used to live in Back Road in Wenhaston. Their cottage was called 'It'll Do' during the 60s through to the 80s. They were Edith and George Ellis. They had one son, Arthur. Edith was a keen villager and WI member. She loved the coach trips and days out to Southwold. George was a local farm-hand, then a barber, setting up business in his shed. He also hustled in egg supplies from his chicken sideline. They were no relation to the Ellis family of Jessie.

I have fond memories of Bessie, who lived over the road, and she was a good friend of Edith's. Tinny was a chap who liked to roam the lanes and peek through people's letter boxes. And Percy was tasked with collecting all the out-house toilet buckets and dispersing the contents on the gooseberries. No wonder they grew in abundance!!

I think the cottage was renamed Rowan Cottage when it changed ownership. Happy memories.

I would be so pleased to get hold of the book, hopefully two copies. If you can think of where I might be able to buy the book, please would you let me know? Thank you. Of course, I would pay the post and packaging.
