# Sign up now! – to help keep your neighbourhood warm for winters to come

#### **Community Thermal Imaging Project**

Funded by the Suffolk Climate Change Partnership



WILDER WENHASTON IS LOOKING FOR VOLUNTEERS to help carry out a second thermal imaging survey in the village in **February 2026**. The first survey was carried out by the former Wenhaston Energy Support Group (WESG)<sup>1</sup> in November 2012, when 21 buildings, including the Village Hall, Methodist Chapel and The Star were surveyed. At the conclusion, the WESG wrote "The results were fascinating and it was quite easy to come up with some simple inexpensive suggestions".

This, our second Thermal Imaging survey, is funded by the Suffolk Climate Change Partnership, which brings all Suffolk councils together to better equip Suffolk for our changing climate.

The Partnership is loaning thermal imaging cameras for community groups like ours to use. We need your help to attend homes in the village, and to take photos using a thermal imaging camera. We are requesting householders, who are interested in having this short survey undertaken, to sign up. The survey is free to all residents. (continued on page 3)

### Where does the rainwater go?

RECENT EDITION OF PRIVATE EYE carried a letter giving information about how all households should qualify for a rebate on sewerage charges from Anglian Water if no *surface water* drainage from your property enters the public sewer. So if your property has soakaways, or other collection like holding tanks, where no rainfall enters the sewer, then you should apply to Anglian Water for the rebate – currently around £70 per year.

I was not aware of this before. I didn't even have to provide evidence of our soakaways to Anglian Water, as they should have details of the property on their records. Apparently, in some cases, rebates will be given for up to six years, that is from the date they knew, or ought to have known, that no surface water drainage from a particular property entered the public sewer; but it's not clear if Anglian are following this. The number to call is: 0345 7820111.

I hope this information is useful – obviously each individual needs to look into this themselves, and any rebate will be dependent upon their own circumstances

### What would we do without wasps?

N NOVEMBER, THE ENTOMOLOGIST, Dr Ian Bedford, spoke to our SWT local group about wasps. He showed us how to view wasps in a different light.

There are an astonishing nine thousand different species of wasp in the UK. All are excellent pollinators, a great help with pest control, and an essential part of the eco system. The great majority are solitary wasps, which are generally no trouble to us. They may live underground, or in nooks and crannies in trees, bushes, or sheds. Gall wasps create odd little growths on leaves, branches, or acorns to harbour their young. Other wasps are parasitic, using caterpillars and grubs as hosts for their eggs. Some, like the bee wolf, hunt a single species to feed their offspring.

Only about 1% of wasps are social, living in large colonies, and we have eight native species. The yearly cycle begins when a mated queen wakes from hibernation, begins to build her nest, and to lay eggs. The workers, infertile females, then labour to build, protect, feed, and repair the nest. Their lives are short, two to three weeks. Male drones hatch later, and once mated with a new queen, they too die. By late

summer, the wasps' need for sugar makes them uninvited guests at outdoor meals, but Ian suggests we resist the urge to swat them. They sting if provoked, and an alarm pheromone in the venom will attract other angry wasps. There are kinder, more effective ways to deal with the issue. They dislike certain smells, so have cloves-studded lemons, peppermint tea, or thyme on the table. A false wasps' nest hanging nearby has been shown to be effective, as wasps are territorial creatures. Their value in our gardens is significant, and where possible, they are best left alone. Wasps may even help humans medically, as their complex venom is being studied for new ways to fight bacteria. It was a fascinating talk that made us look at these useful insects in a much more positive way.

ur next meeting will be on Thursday, January 8<sup>th</sup>, 7.30pm, at Southwold Arts Centre. Local naturalist Tony Brown will talk about 'The Fascination of Fungi'. Admission is £5, to include refreshments, free for under 25s. All are welcome.


