






# News from the Wilder Wenhaston Group



IT'S BEEN A BUSY START to the year for the WW volunteers. We secured a small grant from East Suffolk's *Nature First* Grant Fund, and some hedging plants from the Suffolk Tree Wardens; these have enabled us to carry out three projects in the village.

## **Hedging**

Firstly, two new lengths of hedging have been planted on local landowner's boundaries at Star Hill and Bartholomew's Lane – thanks to Lewis Leech and Fran Desborough for giving permission. Sixteen volunteers made quick work of getting the plants in the ground. This will help provide better wildlife connectivity through the parish.

## **Bulbs**

One thousand snowdrop and bluebell bulbs in the green were bought and planted in the village greens and at the entrance to St Peter's Pightle by eight volunteers. These should help to increase the spring display following the bulb planting that took place in the same areas two years ago.

## **Nest boxes**

Finally, two barn owl and two kestrel boxes have been supplied, to provide nest sites around the new woodlands.

**W**e have also been involved with the *Keep the Heat* thermal imaging project run by Sustainable Suffolk, in conjunction with Halesworth ASH. Twenty-four houses signed up to see how thermally efficient, or otherwise, their house is. The surveys were run by ten volunteers, who went out in the evenings using thermal imaging cameras attached to smart phones. Each householder received images of their house that showed good and bad areas, thus enabling remedial works to be considered and where advice could be obtained.

On 24<sup>th</sup> March, Wilder Wenhaston will hold its AGM at 7pm in the Village Hall. Following on from our successful *Wilder Gardens Question Time* event last year, panellist Luci Skinner, proprietor of Greenways Beds and Borders, will be our speaker. She will talk on *Sustainable Gardening*.

She will be looking at a more sustainable approach to gardening: helping reduce our carbon footprint, helping the environment and cutting costs. We will be discussing reducing inputs and outputs in your garden, as well as organic methods and wildlife gardening. How do we change our modern-day mindset and return to traditional methods that are best for us, our gardens and nature?

# Save our Swifts

## Wenhaston action group

**E**VERY MAY WE START TO SPOT SWIFTS RETURNING from their winter homes in Southern Africa to find a good place to nest and produce the next generation. Experienced parents usually return to where they have nested before, and first time, newly mature birds, will try to find a place near where they fledged 2-3 years before. It is only when they find a nest site that the birds will finally have a rest from flying.

Cameras in some of the nest boxes in the village have clearly shown pairs of swifts cohabiting and assembling a simple nest before producing a small clutch of eggs and rearing their chicks usually no more than two. It's thrilling that the young birds can then be seen growing and practising wing strokes before disappearing, usually by August, on their airborne journeys back to Africa. Bird ringing has also shown the return of birds to the same nest box where they had bred the year before.

Our group exists to promote awareness of these amazing birds in our village, and to help with any queries you may have, in particular about providing nest sites and boxes for the returning swifts. We now have roughly 65 boxes up on walls in the village and hope to see occupancy rates increasing. A calling system will definitely improve the chances of attracting swifts to nest in a new place.

**W**e can also give advice to those who may be considering renovation and building works and are concerned about affecting pre-existing nest sites. Contact me, Kate, via our e mail [wenhastonSOSActiongroup@gmail.com](mailto:wenhastonSOSActiongroup@gmail.com) if you would like to chat.

Some of you may enjoy trying to spot other birds which look a bit similar to swifts: swallows, house martins and sand martins. These are all seen in the village, and the Group would like to also help residents with any queries they may have about helping these as well. These three species are all members of the *Hirundinidae* family – *Hirundo* means 'swallow' in Latin. Swifts are not related but can be mistaken for these other birds. Their family is *Apodidae*, meaning 'without feet' in Ancient Greek.

Here is a very useful graphic created by Robert Booth of SOSSHM<sup>1</sup>.

This shows the differences between the species using very clear photographic images. Thanks to Robert Booth.

# Wenhaston Commons Group

## What have we been doing recently?



DURING THE OFTEN DULL, DAMP and chilly, but occasionally bright and sparkly, winter weather, the Commons Group has been working to continue to improve and maintain the special Lowland Heath environment of the commons that we are lucky enough to have here in Wenhaston. The aim is to maintain a balance – of trees, gorse and bracken – to promote the growth of heather, and to keep areas of clear ground, which provide important wildlife with the habitat it needs to breed and thrive. A recent star of the show was a nightjar that chose to live for a while on Blackheath last summer, enchanting many with its extraordinary churring call, heard each evening for a couple of weeks. A family of woodlarks was also seen, indicating successful breeding of this rare ground nesting bird. The silver studded blue butterflies continue to breed on certain areas of Blackheath. They are reliant on heather and have a special

relationship with black ants which share their environment.

During the bird breeding season, from March to September, we are very grateful to responsible dog owners who keep their pets on leads when exercising in the area near the upper edge of the sandpit – this is where the woodlarks may nest, as long as they are not disturbed.

The group has funded important larger scale work on Blackheath, contracted to Crispin Chalker, who has done a wonderful job using the Ryetec Machine to clear areas of bracken and gorse at scale, particularly on the area south of Blackheath Road. He has also mechanically re-faced the sand pit on Blackheath which usually provides nest sites for sand martins each summer. The cliff of sand was deteriorating with falls from above creating heaps that predators could use to access the birds' nest holes, and volunteers digging by hand were fighting a losing battle. The digger has completely refreshed

the surface and base, something that will encourage sand martins to create new nest holes this summer.

Volunteer work parties are still required, as smaller scale, hands-on work is needed to remove gorse and other overgrowth when it is integrated with areas of heather or other features that must be preserved.

There has also been a programme of tree and hedge planting on

Blackheath in recent years. We hope to continue to see new members coming along to join us twice a month to enjoy being outdoors, doing something active and useful, getting to know others, and enjoying a well-earned coffee break, often with flapjacks. No obligation to come to every date. Whenever you can come you will be welcome.

Our March work parties are at: south Blackheath on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> and at Bickers Heath on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup>, starting 10am.

Other ongoing work done by members includes maintaining and monitoring bird nest boxes on Bickers Heath, Church Common, as well as Merton Wood, Vicarage Grove, and a few in St Peter's churchyard. We also work to encourage meadow plants in part of the churchyard, to the north of the church, and are currently trying out various techniques to promote biodiversity. We have also helped with the pruning of some of the churchyard yew trees in conjunction with the Parish Church Council for the same reason.

Last year Crispin was also contracted to create significant gaps in the overgrown areas of gorse near housing on the east end of Blackheath to reduce fire risk.

We coordinate with other conservation groups in the village, and recently all enjoyed a very successful joint Wildlife Quiz night on January 16<sup>th</sup> with Blyth Woods.


