All ages, from 7 to 70, will be playing a selection of instruments: piano, flute, saxophone, harp, mandolin, violin, guitar, piano accordion, concertina – and more! Wilder Wenhaston

IN MARCH WILDER WENHASTON HELD their AGM. Looking back over the previous twelve months, much had been achieved, thanks to the steering group and all our volunteers.

We held our second *Open Wilder Gardens*, which was a great success; and we included a *Gardeners' Question Time* in the Village Hall.

That resulted in us organising a peat-free compost buying scheme, and we sold 84 bags of professional quality product – thanks to Kate Eyre for locating suitable stock and supplier, and also to Mike Gower for the use of his barn for storage.

The River Group has been very busy organising testing from Laxfield to Southwold, and we are now part of the Four Rivers Project run by Deben Climate Centre. Full details of our findings will be in next month's *Warbler* – and it's not pleasant reading.

We applied for a small grant from East Suffolk's *Nature First* grant scheme. This enabled us to increase the number of free hedging we had obtained from The Conservation Volunteers to allow us to plant 170 metres of hedge on Star Hill and on Bartholomew's Lane – thanks to Lewis Leech and Fran Desborough for permission to plant on their land,



and to the 20 volunteers who planted. The aim is to help join up habitats around the parish using hedges as highways. The grant also paid for 1000 snowdrop and bluebell bulbs which were planted on Well Green, around the phone box, and on the green at the Bramfield Road junction. All planted in one-and-a-half hours by ten volunteers. The grant also funded two barn owl boxes and two kestrel boxes, which were put on suitable areas of farmland. The left-over timber made some tit boxes for Blackheath.

We organised the *Keep the Heat* thermal imaging project in conjunction with Halesworth ASH. Thanks to Ann Follows's organisation, 25 homes were surveyed by a team of ten volunteers. Using thermal imaging cameras homes were surveyed for heat loss, and advice given on how to rectify any issues.

Alexanders is dominating our roadsides and foot paths swamping any other wildflowers. Originally brought here by the Romans, our milder winters are enabling it to thrive and spread. Several volunteers have been removing the flower heads to stop it

spreading. It's a biennial, so repeatedly doing this should reduce its dominance over time.

We are at the early stages of producing a parish Biodiversity Plan. We have met with the team from the *Local Nature Recovery Strategy* which is a Suffolk and Norfolk County Council initiative. Each parish has been mapped using existing biological information; then a target

has been given as a potential improvement. We have the Parish Council's support for compiling the document, and would welcome any suggestions, or indeed help.

The AGM ended with a talk by Luci Skinner on *Sustainable Gardening*, an enlightening and very professional presentation, leaving lots of food for thought. *Alan Miller*

Who are Blyth Woods and what do they do?

THIS WAS A QUESTION POSED TO US RECENTLY and we thought we would share the answer.....

Blyth Woods is a Charity set up by a group of local people in 2012; their main aim is to develop wildlife areas that can be used for education and also enjoyed by the Community, now and in generations to come.



We initially made contact with Wenhaston Primary School. A seed-to-tree programme was set up, and a tree nursery built at the school in preparation for any future projects. The children also helped to design our logo.

In 2016, Grove Piece was acquired, followed by the adjacent field, Malsters, and in 2020 we took over the management of Vicarage Grove from the Commons Group. Ponds were restored, bird boxes installed, holly removed to increase light, hedging and fruit trees planted and 'dead hedges' and benches built. This area is collectively known as Grove Woods and situated on the path between Bramfield Road and Bartholomew's Lane. It's only a few minutes from the centre of Wenhaston and enjoyed daily by many people. Working parties continue and most of the regular school sessions, planned and run by us, are held there.

Our latest project is St Peter's Pightle, situated at the end of Church Lane. It has involved the local community and Wenhaston Primary School since its conception in 2024. This previous arable land, covering more than 4.5 acres, has been the main focus of

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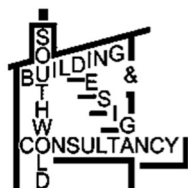
